Adrian Jarvis

Deputy General Registrar

Adrian Jarvis is New Zealand's Acting Registrar General and is leading work that will see the introduction of a new civil registration system in 2024.

Adrian has held the Deputy Registrar General delegation since 2013 and has worked closely with previous Registrar General Jeff Montgomery (now Russell Burnard). This includes managing Births, Deaths and Marriages Operations from 2013 – 2019. His current role sits within the Department of Internal Affair's Te Ara Manaaki programme, a large five-year programme of work that is helping reshape how people connect with government services around life events, such as registering marriages. The aim is to make those services easier to use, easier to access and offering better protection of people's precious data.

THE FUTURE WITH BDM

At this year's conference, Adrian will be focusing on the changes Celebrants need to be aware of in advance of next year's introduction of a new Civil Registration system.

Founder/Managing Director, Animation Research Ltd

Sir Ian Lemuel Taylor CNZM (born c.1950) is a prominent businessman from Dunedin, New Zealand. Born in Kaeo to a Pākehā father and Māori mother, he grew up in Raupunga and went to a Catholic boarding school in Masterton. Ian is married to Liz and they have two children. Ian has an LLB degree from the University of Otago.

A former television presenter, Taylor founded Taylormade Media in 1989 as a television production company. The following year he established Animation Research Limited, which quickly became one of the top computer animation companies in New Zealand and known internationally for its work, particularly in television advertising and sports graphics.

Taylor was inducted into the New Zealand Technology Hall of Fame in 2009 and was named North & South Magazines 2010 New Zealander of the Year. He was awarded an Honorary Fellowship of the New Zealand Computer Society (HFNZCS) in 2010, the top honour of the ICT sector in NZ. Taylor was made a Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit in the 2012 New Year Honours, for services to television and business.

Liz's poems can also be found in other places including *Landfall*, Stasis, The Spinoff's The Friday Poem and Ōrongohau Best New Zealand Poems 2017. In 2022 Liz had a highly commended story in the Sargeson Prize, was first runner up in the Red Hen Press Quill Prose Award, and their stories were shortlisted for the Bridport Prize and longlisted for the Commonwealth Short Story Prize in 2021. Liz has had residencies in Krakow UNESCO City of Literature, Poland (2019) and (virtually) at the National Centre for Writing, Norwich, UK, (2021) and collaborated with Dunedin UNESCO City of Literature in 2020 on The Possibilities Project.

Claire is a mother of four, Founder of Only with Love and the OWL Foundation and Co Director of Manaaki Mats. Claire is internationally recognised as a leading Home Death Care Practitioner, Celebrant, Educator and Advisor. She feels intuitively that death and dying belongs with whānau and communities and is passionate about sharing her skills, knowledge and experiences to help families. Since setting up her OWL practice in the UK in 2014 Claire has presented regularly at international conferences and been invited to speak of and teach gentle care of the body around the world. Claire is founder member of the Home Funeral Network UK, Aotearoa Independent Death Voices Alliance and AHFA, the newly formed Australian Home Funeral Alliance. Within NZ she is raising awareness of sustainable death care options, facilitating workshops, developing education within hospice and beginning a non-profit life and death learning, care and resource centre. In 2016 Claire was awarded Runner Up Green Funeral Director of the Year and was Commended for her OWL Funeral Services at the 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 UK Good Funeral Awards.

More recently Claire has been honoured by Amnesty International for her campaigning and advocacy work and awarded an MBE for her services to Consumer Rights.

WORKSHOP

MAINSTREAM MEDIA - YOUR FRIEND AND FOE

The workshop would be conversational in nature with a blend of real life Main Stream Media examples (i.e. traditional or established broadcasting or publishing outlets like Newspapers, Radio and TV). The purpose of the session is to bring awareness and a set of takeaway tools that celebrants could utilise in their Kete to manage or initiate Media Inquiries. There will be a Q&A.

The key aspects to be covered:

- The CANZ Media Policy and how it applies to members i.e. Knowing what you can say and what you can't say (keeping yourself safe)
- · How to manage an initial contact by Media
- How to initiate a Media Release

Philippa has been a registered marriage and civil union celebrant since 2005, and also conducts funerals and memorial services.




